What would the city be like for the superheroes? Would you like that place? Focus on field work skills</p>	<p>Why can't penguins live in Blackshaw Moor? <u>Locational Knowledge</u> Build on previous term's work by locating these places on maps. Where are we in the UK? Name the 4 countries of the UK and their capital cities. Locate New York and America where the superheroes lived. Locate places where animals we are studying live in UK and begin to look at wider world. Focus on map work skills</p>	<p>What if your house was on stilts? <u>Human and Physical Knowledge</u> Build on previous term's work by learning about the continents and weather patterns around the world. Learn about Tobago using the story of Gregory Cool Apply skills acquired in fieldwork and map work</p>
<p>KS1 B</p>	<p>What if Beegu landed in Blackshaw Moor? <u>Place knowledge</u> Start with 'me' Use aerial photographs to investigate our local area. What do you like about the place where you live? What is the place in the story like? Would you like this place? Is it the same or different to where you live?</p>	<p>What if, like Mr Grinling, your food couldn't reach you? <u>Locational Knowledge</u> Build on previous term's work by locating BM and capital cities on a map of the UK. Name the seas and find out more about living on islands or beside the sea like Mr Grinling.</p>	<p>What if, like Mowgli you could meet the animals of the Indian Jungles? <u>Human and Physical Knowledge</u> Build on previous term's work by learning about the continents and weather patterns around the world. Learn about Chembakoli a village in India. Apply skills acquired in fieldwork and map work</p>
<p>KS2 A</p>	<p>Walk Like an Egyptian Where is Egypt in relation to the UK? What is the landscape, terrain and climate like in Egypt? Why would people choose to live in cities in Egypt? How does the River Nile determine where things grow and where people live? What is its impact on the country as a whole? This will lead on to the location of other major rivers around the world and the water cycle.</p>	<p>The Super-humans Where is Greece in relation to the UK? What is the landscape, terrain and climate like in Greece? Use maps, atlases and the internet to research. How would we get to Greece from the UK?</p>	<p>Rambling Round the Rainforest Where is Brazil in relation to the UK? What is the landscape, terrain and climate like in Brazil? Which continent does Brazil belong to? Which other countries are in South America? What physical and human features are there in Brazil? How do the features of Brazil and more specifically the Amazon rainforest and river affect what is going on in the rest of the world? And how does what we do affect it? How is Brazil different to the UK? How is it the same?</p>
<p>KS2 B</p>	<p>Location, Location, Location Where is Blackshaw Moor? What does it look like on a map and satellite? What human and physical features can we see in our local area? Locate key places around the UK. (London, Stoke on Trent, Chester, Llandudno etc) How has the land use of Blackshaw Moor changed over time? Link to Poland. Look at a variety of maps of Poland to discover what we can about its features and landscape. Which other European countries are close to Poland? What are their capital cities?</p>	<p>Caesar Seizes Chester Where did the Romans originate from? Why did they invade our country? How does Italy compare to the UK in terms of landscape, terrain and climate? Which counties and cities in the UK did the Romans have an impact on? Use maps and atlases to locate them. What are volcanoes and how are they made? Where are they in the world? Why don't we have any volcanoes in our country?</p>	<p>The Flintstones Where would be a good place to settle during the stone age? What would you look for in a location?</p>
